Imagine the scene – it's mid morning on Christmas day and you're walking your dog and thinking about sitting down for Christmas dinner.

But then disaster strikes – your dog is injured and you've got to get him to a vet quickly.

That's the dilemna that Robert Wass faced when his dog, Levi, badly cut his leg on broken glass in a local park on Christmas day.

Thankfully, we operate a 24 hour emergency service, so as soon as Mr Wass called us we sprang into action.

Our on call vet, John Burton, arranged for vet nurse Becky Peel to open up our Dodworth Road branch and within no time at all Levi was undergoing surgery to have his wound stitched.

Not only that, but Mr Wass also managed to get his 1pm Christmas dinner while the surgery was taking place!

He said: "I was surprised and really pleased to find that Abbey Vets were able to treat Levi on Christmas day. At first I thought I would have to go to a vet out of the



area, which would have been very difficult because I don't drive. Abbey Vets soon treated Levi's injuries and I was able to take him home a few hours later."
